She was educated at Orange River Presbyterian Church and Marlborough Elementary School in Orange River. She also became an expert seamstress under the tutelage of her mother. Albertha, married Daniel Vincent Salmon (recently deceased) and raised a family of 9 children: Pauline, Carl, Alvin, Everard, Monica, Margaret, Fay, Danny and Carol. The family then lived in Kingston. Albertha was a homemaker and did dressmaking at home to help support her family. Albertha also loved and cared for her grandchildren and other children in her neighborhood. She loved the people who she came to know and adopted them into her family. She was very kind and loving and could be counted upon to help out when anyone had a personal or financial crisis. And her love was reciprocated as her extended family always talked about her kindness and kept in touch with her regularly. In 1977 Albertha joined Daniel, who had immigrated years earlier to New York in search of better job opportunities and in 2006 they moved to Ocala, Florida. Mom was a quiet, introspective person, but she enjoyed meeting people. She also had a subtle sense of humor that could surprise you; she even liked boxing. Mom loved the Lord. Any night you could walk into her room and be blessed while she had her devotional prayers. Albertha is survived and greatly missed by her 9
