Obituary of Alexander Miller, Jr. Alexander Wytok Miller, Jr. died from congestive heart failure on August 5, 2015. He was 87 years old. Al was born on January 26, 1928 in Yonkers, New York. He was the third and youngest son of Alex and Janet Miller. The Miller brothers, Al, Pete and Tom, were best friends and played together on a daily basis. Growing up during the Great Depression may have caused some hardships but it also forged a strong bond between the boys. They shared one bicycle, taking turns riding it while the other two ran along side. Al's efforts to keep up with his older brothers paid off. In high school he excelled as a sprinter, claiming the New York State High School record for the 100-yard dash with a time 10.4 seconds. Following graduation, Al joined the United States Army and fought in the brutal winter conditions of North Korea. After serving his country, Al began his profession as an x-ray technician in the Veterans Hospital in Buffalo, NY. It was here he met his future wife Janet. After the birth of their son Alex, they moved to Lake Ronkonkoma, NY where they lived until Al's retirement from the VA hospital. The family moved to Ocala, Florida for a well-deserved life of relaxation and friendship. Al loved the Ocala community and enjoyed taking visiting family members on tours to area attractions. His wife Janet, his parents Alex and Janet Miller, and his brothers, Thomas Miller and Peter Miller, predeceased Al. His son Alex, nephew Peter Miller, nieces Sheila Miller McDonald, Donna Miller Ebel, Laurie Miller, survive him.
