Alison C. Collier, 39, was born in Ocala on June 21, 1977. She passed away on Monday, Nov 14th, at Legacy House. As a marriage and family therapist, Alison dedicated her life to discovering, understanding and influencing human behavior. After earning her master's degree from the University of Florida, Alison returned to Ocala where she headed Brave Hearts Counseling Services. Given the opportunity to counsel audiences outside of her practice, Alison spoke around the state on behavioral topics ranging from parenting to self-fulfillment, and was in the process of adapting her message into a manuscript. Compassionate, quick-witted, indefatigable and brave, Alison counseled her clients, friends and family, and left a print on us all.
