Obituary of Alphonso Lindsey Alphonso Lindsey was born on March 15, 1927 in Birmingham, Alabama to Charlie and Eria (Burton) Lindsey. He was the fourth of seven children. He graduated from Wenonah High School and went on to attend classes at Miles College. He served in the United States Army during Korea from 1950 through 1952 and remained in the Army Reserve until 1956. After his Honorable Discharge he worked at various positions until he settled into the Railway Express Agency. There he worked as a Router and Freight Handler from 1955 to 1970. On January 13, 1952 in Birmingham, he married Clotelia Harris, his life-time companion. In 1956, they moved to Chicago, Illinois where they remained until 1974 when they relocated to Ocala, Florida. Alphonso loved the Lord and was baptized in 1953. In Chicago he was an active member of Sheldon Heights Church of Christ. There he was a Sunday school teacher, song director, Elder and Treasurer. He was also active in the Ocala community through several organizations. He was a member of the Disabled American Veterans Chapter # 85 where he served as Chaplain, later he became the Regional Chaplain. He was also a member of the Condominium Association Board for Fairway # 4. On Monday, December 18, 2006, Alphonso Lindsey passed away after a short stay in the Veterans Hospital in Gainesville, Florida. A devoted husband, father and friend. He is survived by his wife of fifty-five years, Clotelia (Harris) Lindsey, of Ocala, a son, Bertram Lindsey of Torrance, California, four daughters, Virginita Myers of Ocala, Jacqueline Lindsey of Winter Garden, Florida, Edwina DiSilvestre

and her husband Anthony of San Jose, California and Regina Lindsey of Tallahassee, Florida, by two brothers, Theophilus and Vertis Lindsey, both of Chicago, six grandchildren and two great-grandchildren, as well as by several nieces, nephews and a large extended family.
