Obituary of Anna McCall Mrs. Anna McCall, 95, of Ocala, FL passed away peacefully at her residence on Sunday, October 30, 2011. Mrs. McCall was born in Zurich, Switzerland on March 21, 1916. She immigrated to the USA in 1932. In 6 months she learned to speak and read English by using an English/German dictionary and listening to the radio and reading the newspaper. Her father helped her get a job at a Fred Harvey restaurant downtown Chicago. At the age of 26 Anna married Eugene Beyersdorfer and settled down to become a home maker and mother, raising her 6 children. Not only was her focus on her family, she also served in her church through the years hosting dinners for hundreds of people and being a strong example of Christian Faith. Once her children were raised she worked many years as a professional housekeeper and took great pride in her work. She suffered the loss of her son Arthur when he died at the age of 37 due to complications of a kidney disease. Anna is survived by five of her six children, Karl, Andrea, Marcia, Vikki and Theresa; 15 grand children and 13 great-grand children. She lived a long and full life and will be greatly missed.
