Obituary of Arletta Hartmann Arletta Hartmann, 89, of Ocklawaha, Florida, passed away Saturday, February 7, 2015 at Harbor Chase Nursing home in Lady Lake. Arletta was born October 18, 1925 in Plymouth, MN to Elmer and Gertrude Schmidt. She married Warren Joseph Hartmann on August 28, 1952 at St. Joseph's Church in Plymouth, MN. He preceded her in death on March 5, 1986. Surviving her is her son, Warren (Linda) Hartmann of Peoria, IL; granddaughters, Julia of Schaumburg, IL and Caroline of Peoria, IL. She is also survived by her nephews, Lynn (Sheryl), Brian (Jeanne) and Mark Streeter of Minnesota. She was also preceded in death by her parents and sister, Edris Streeter of New Hope, MN. Arletta grew up on the family farm in Plymouth, MN on Schmidt Lake. She graduated from Robbinsdale High School in 1943, attended the College of St. Catherine in St. Paul, MN and graduated in 1947 with a degree in Home Economics. After graduation, she taught Home Economics classes at the high school level in Moose Lake, MN and later worked as a County Home Agent for Wright County, MN. She then worked for International Harvester as a Home Economist to promote their home appliances. In performing those duties, she hosted one of the first home cooking shows on KSTP TV on Minneapolis. In 1950, Arletta met her future husband on a Caribbean cruise aboard the S.S. Cefalu, which was a cargo ship that carried both bananas and passengers. She and her husband moved to Elmhurst, IL where they raised their son. She enjoyed gourmet cooking, traveling, fishing, horseback riding, gardening, reading and attending the

theater. She was a loving mother and wife and was a member of Immaculate Conception Church. When her husband retired in 1975, they moved to Florida. She was active in the local garden club there and continued in her love of cooking, traveling and reading. Her funeral and burial will be in her home town of Minnesota.
