Dale Donald Meyer, 103, of Ocala, Florida died peacefully on December 9, 2021. Dale was born at home near Stratford, Wi. on May 8, 1918, fourth son of George and Hazel (Larkee) Meyer. He was predeceased by his beloved wife, Lucille (Rowe) and son, Roger Dale Meyer as well as brothers Hal, Glen, and Paul and sisters Joyce Karnath and Carole Bierl.

Dale is survived by his daughter, Marsha Albats and son-in-law Paul Albats; two grandchildren, Lisa Kahraman, and Paul Andrew Albats as well as great-grandsons, Bruno and Andre Kahraman, along with many nieces and nephews.

Dale grew up in several small central Wisconsin towns and graduated from Ondossagon High School and operated the family's Mountain Valley Cheese factory in Barksdale during the war years with his wife, Lucille from Washburn. He received a BS from UW, Madison with honors in 1949. He began his career with Hood milk as a plant manager in Maine and later in Boston. Later he was employed by Arcade Farms, Birds Eye, and Lipton and lived in Syracuse, Buffalo, and Rochester NY and Flemington NJ.

He enjoyed many happy years of retirement in the warm sunshine of Ocala, Florida. He had many interests. He was a serious bicyclist and competed for years in the Senior Games, winning numerous awards. He supported Operation Migration, an organization involved in whooping crane preservation. He and Lucille took several extended vacations including to Norway and Switzerland and to Arizona. He was very interested in his family

history, especially his Mayflower and the Revolutionary War ancestors. He left behind his own recollections in "Dale's Tales", a fascinating account of his early life.

But, his greatest love was his wife and family. He loved arranging family trips and events. He leaves us with so many memories of his playful smile.

He will be buried with his wife and son in Woodland Cemetery in Washburn, WI.
