Obituary of Douglas Potter Douglas R. Potter, 92 years old, of Ocala, Florida died on June 14th, 2011. Doug was born in Foxboro, Massachusetts on October 3rd, 1918 to the late G Rea and Jennie (Sim) Potter. He was a graduate of Foxboro High School and served his country during World War II in the Seebes branch of the United States Navy. His employment previous to the war and immediately following the war was at Fales Machine in Walpole, MA and the Foxboro Company. He then worked for the United States Post Office until his retirement in 1975. Upon his retirement he relocated to Newport, NH for 8 years where he enjoyed golf, snowmobiling, skiing, ice fishing and maple sugaring. He spent the last 27 years in beautiful Ocala, Florida. He is survived by his beloved wife of 69 years Dorothy (Cady) Potter and his two children: Brad Potter of Paisley, FL and Dottie Potter Zenaty of Wilbraham, MA.; 3 grandchildren: Theresa Reese and husband Mark, Cindy Schofield and husband Geoff, Kristi Taylor and husband Charlie; 3 step grandchildren: Tom Zenaty and wife Jane, Paul Zenaty and wife Kaye, Will Zenaty and wife Deb; 4 great-grandchildren: Christopher, Scott, Robert and Michael; 4 step great-grandchildren: Leah, David, Mitchell and Jordan.
