Ella Mae Reulbach, 90, gracefully passed away on Wednesday September 7, 2022 at the Estelle House Hospice in Ocala, FL of natural causes after a brief illness.

On March 29th, 1932 in New Rochelle, NY. Ella Mae Stockton was born. She was the daughter of Grace and Hubert Jones. She graduated from Pelham High School in Pelham, NY. Throughout her life she displayed a high level of artistic skill in drawing, painting, and sculpting - you name it, she could draw it, paint or sculpt it. She was also a skilled seamstress.
