Frederick Carl BOGATH, 99, of Belleview, Florida, passed away March 30, 2019 at Brandley House in Summerfield, Florida. Born in Jabing, Austria he resided in Florida for over 48 years. Fred worked for Charles Wagner Litho Machinery Company prior to requesting a leave of absence to enter the military. Serving in the United States Army from April 28, 1942 to October 18, 1945 he was involved in five battles and campaigns, Ardennes, Central Europe, Normandy, Northern France and the Rhineland receiving the European-African-Middle Eastern Service medal. After returning to Manhattan, New York he married his long time love Emma Jurena. Fred landed a job as a barge captain for the Erie-Lackawanna railroad where he held various positions during his 30 years of service. After marrying Emma they moved to Montville, New Jersey where they raised three children, Frederick John Bogath, Gary Carl Bogath and daughter Gail Lynn (Bogath) McDorman. Nearly five decades ago Fred, Emma and Gail moved to Florida where they purchase and ran a small Mobile Home park. He was a family man who loved camping, boating, clamming, fishing, playing cards, and board games. Additionally, he traveled around the state on day trips which were always great family fun. Fred also had a fascination for tinkering always having several projects in process much to the amusement of family and friends. He is survived by two children Frederick and Gail, daughter-in-law Sharon Bogath of Burien, Washington and Gail's partner Stephen D. Smith of Gulf Shores, Alabama.
