Gary Keller Huthmacher, 83 of Orange County, New Jersey, died peacefully 6 minutes past midnight on the 2nd day of February, 2019. Gary served in the United States Navy from 1953-1955, aboard the USS Kenneth Whiting, out of San Diego, California. Upon completion of his tour, Gary entered the field of insurance where he remained until retirement.
