George Andrew Brooker, age 81, of Ocala, Florida, passed away on April 10, 2026 in Ocala, Florida

George was born in New York City, NY to the proud parents of George & Ruth (Sager) Brooker on February 24, 1945. He graduated from DeWitt Clinton High School in 1962. He then served in the US Navy Reserves from 1962 to 1968. George married his childhood sweetheart, Carolyn Stavich in 1966 and they went on to have four children. In 1966, for a short time, George took over the family business as a plumbing contractor after his father's death and then pursued a career as an Operational Engineer. In 1974, he was transferred to Chicago to open a new large office building. He quickly climbed the corporate ladder and when he retired in 2010, he was Executive Director at the company that managed the maintenance of the International Terminal at O'Hare Airport in Chicago.

George and his wife Carolyn moved to Ocala, FL in 2012 to escape the harsh winters of Chicago. He loved cooking for his family and friends and even volunteered at the soup kitchen in Ocala, preparing and serving meals for the less fortunate.
