Glynn-Ann Riddleberger, 80, of Ocala, Florida, passed away peacefully and went to the Lord on January 2, 2026, at Cates House, Ocala after a brief stay.

### A Life of Love and Dedication

Born on May 17, 1945, in Portsmouth, Virginia, Glynn-Ann was the daughter of the late Glenn and Erma Satterthwaite. A graduate of Churchland High School, she went on to a dedicated 20-year career with Virginia Power. She received her CNA certification and she began her own care giving business. In her spare time, she volunteered with Meals on Wheels as well as at the Williams School in Norfolk, VA.

In 1963, she married the love of her life, Denny Riddleberger. Their 62-year marriage was a testament to passion, fun, and unwavering dedication, having just celebrated their most recent anniversary on December 26th, 1963.

Glynn-Ann was the home maker for the Riddleberger family throughout Denny's 7 year professional baseball career. Due to her unwavering dedication to her family she was known as a "hell of a woman". In their travels together to 7 different states and 2 foreign countries she always made every

place their home. Known affectionately too many as “Sissy,” to her younger brothers and “Aunt Sissy” to her niece and nephews. Her home was a sanctuary where everyone felt welcomed as family.

She was a woman of distinct style and simple pleasures. She found joy in her garden, get lost in a good book, and spent many afternoons mastering crossword puzzles. She was always at home on or near the water, including cruising on the Elizabeth River on their pontoon boat. She loved to dance and was never happier than when she was cooking a meal for those she loved. Above all, she cherished her role as a grandmother, spending countless days and nights with her only grandchild, Carly, whom she loved with all her heart.

Glynn-Ann’s legacy of warmth and strength lives on through her family and is survived by: Denny Riddleberger, her husband; her daughter Denise Bearden (her partner Paul Cairns); her son Michael Riddleberger (daughter-in-law Denise). As well as her grandchild Carly Blair, who affectionately called her “MeMaw”, (her husband Derek Blair). Her brother Mark Satterthwaite and her niece and nephews: Christin Wilson, Glenn Satterthwaite, and Ian Satterthwaite, (Lacey Harms), as well as her great niece and nephew.
