Jim was an enthusiastic golfer and traveler, and crammed more living into the last years of his life than most people do in a lifetime. He is survived by his wife, Anne, his children, Dawn Prestipino, Jeff Enos, Tim Enos and Jayne Pheil; ten grandchildren and three great-grandchildren.
