ENLISTED IN THE REGULAR NAVY MARCH 1941.

TOOK BOOT TRAINING AND SCHOOLING AT NTC NORFOLK, VA FIRST SHIP USS LUCE (DD522) OPERATED IN THE ATLANTIC AND PACIFIC. I WAS IN TASK FORCE 94.6 FIRST EVER LAND BOMBARDMENT OF THE JAPANESE HOMELAND. LOST IN A BATTLE WITH 30 JAP KAMIKAZE PLANES 4 MAY 1945, AT OKINAWA RESCUED FROM THE CHINA SEA BY USS HENRY A. WILEY (DM 29). TRANSFERRED TO USS: MERCY, 4 DAYS LATER TRANSFERRED TO FLEET HOSPITAL III GUAM. THEN TO R/S TO BUBA P.I. TO USS SHENANDOAH AD 26- TO USS ESTES AGC 11, TO USS TURNER (DDR 834) TO NTC GREAT LAKES, IL TO USS LAFFEY DD724, TO USS RANDOLPH CVA 15, TO NOB BERMUDA BWI .. SERVED IN ALL ENLISTED PAY GRADES WAS PROMOTED TO CHIEF PETTY OFFICER AT THE AGE OF 21.
