One night 3 months or so, you were in my dream which was REAL, and you were talking to me, I could feel your love towards me which was absent for most of my life, and you were saying something about DAD to me, but I could not understand the things you were saying. I can tell you Mom that I still love you and I hope your are as well, and I know you are. Your know in heaven, how Dad is treating me like he did you for So Many Years and the lies as you had lied to me all these years, but that's forgiven, Dad is treating me like not a Father should. He lies to me, to others, and is a two faced person. His new friend, Ms. Ruth was nice and has taken care of Dad but she is like Dad. She use to call me twice a week and tell me how much she loved me and how much Dad loved me. LIES. No calls from either of them. I told them I had to move back into my family home because of the recession. Dad blamed me and Jim for the recession. It was all my fault. He upset me terribly that I had to hang up two or three times. I believe Dad is maybe beginnning the early ons on Alzheimers. I have heard from all the Eatmons and the most of the Brooks that Dad has changed and does not want any part of them, meaning that he does not acknowleged them or short with them. It does not matter anymore to me. You chose that and Dad has to choose that as well, which has already been told. He lies all the time to people who asks about me, how I am doing? Well guess what Mom, I am in 200% poverty rate myself. Jim is losing his business and will soon the home our children grew up in. My fault right? Andrew in unemployed for the four months, can't find a job. Jim told Matt he had to leave and I have not seen or talked to him since February. I know he totaled his car and was

seriously hurt but survived. I don't know where he is living or working. Andrew is still hear at the house living with his Crohn's Disease. Surviving like the three of can. I am down to almost 110 lbs. Jim is down to 142 lbs. Andrew 120 lbs. I have qualified for food stamps \$300 a month for the 3 of us. Not much when it does not cover paper items, personal items, hot food, etc. I just wanted to wish you Happy Mother's Day from the Kerr househould. I also wanted to let you know how we are doing and surviving. I wanted to send flowers through Brick City Florists but too expensive and if I did, I know they would be delivered but somehow I know someone would remove them as if I was or did not send anything.
