He was a gentle and very humble soul. He had the God given ability to play many instruments including, rhythm guitar, bass guitar, the drums, the keyboard, the trombone, and just recently Jody learned he knew how to play the violin. From a once

very shy child he had blossomed into a vibrant spirit-filled young man on fire for God. As a child he played baseball and soccer, but it became very evident that this kid had more of a heart toward music and the arts. He started his first guitar lessons when he was about 8 or 9 years old. There is no doubt that Josh was a very special gift of God and there is no doubt also that he is continuing his singing and music now in the very presence of the Almighty, clapping his hands and worshipping with all of his heart. Aside from his music, Josh loved animals and had a wonderful sense of humor. He also had a very serious side, and he cared very deeply for all of the friends he made. I don't know anyone who was an enemy or didn't like Josh. I know there is more that could be said, but the bottom line is that Josh was a man after God's own heart.
