The Celebration of Life will be on June 30th starting at 1 pm. The family will be providing fried fish and other meats and requests guest bring a covered dish if

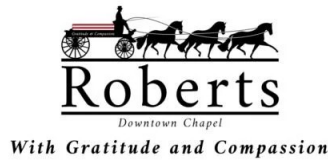
possible.
