“ I fished with Larry Brown for most of my life starting in the third grade in Hialeah Florida in a deep rockpit that held big bass. We would walk miles to a store to buy lures then traveled to nearby canals and lakes on bicycles casting for Bass, Snook, Tarpon, Bluegills, anything that swam. Larry got a 1956 Chevy and we would sneak out of bed in the middle of the night and drive 65 miles to fish for Snook on Turner River and speed back in time to go to school. The Chevy was so fast that we outran the cops one night on the Tamiami Trail leaving the red lights in the distance. I played football with him at parks and at Hialeah High. In 1969 we drove to NW Ontario and caught so many fish we were hired by the camp owner and outfished his resident guides. We cast for Snook from my canoe on most rivers leading into Everglades National Park, then the wildest sections of the park in any boat we had. Larry and I helped his dad build a home in the everglades on Turner River Road and Larry & Marty raised a family near Everglades City. When Larry moved to Ocala I missed him as a fishing partner and I was off covering wars and disasters as a photojournalist so we didnt see each other much. When I needed Larry to bring his boys & crew to pour concrete for the house in the keys, Larry came and we poured the strongest house in the area. I had worked with Larry & his father during summers pouring concrete and this house built with Larry Brown concrete, stood like a rock during Hurricane Irma. No damage. Larry Brown was the best fisherman I ever knew and the best concrete man I ever knew a fishishing partner that cannot be replaced. I know he is in heaven catching Snook on a Red & White Mirror Lure. Thank you Larry for a lifetime of great memories.
