Obituary of Marion Hewitt Born October 29, 1936 in Manhattan, New York, Harry and Naomi Williams welcomed their first bouncing baby girl Marion Juanita Hewitt. The oldest of four siblings, she grew up in Port Jefferson, NY and attended Port Jefferson Public Schools. As a young lady she moved back to NYC and worked for Chuck Full O'Nuts Coffee Shop as a waitress and cashier. In 1962, Marion married, became a mother and later began her career with the New York City Subway in 1969 as a booth clerk. In 1973, Marion became the First African American Motor Woman in NYC Transit History where she excelled in this career until retiring in 1991. After remarrying her best friend and love of her life Richard Thomas Hewitt, they relocated to Ocala, Florida where they enjoyed many years of love and happiness until her departure on December 26, 2014. Marion was a devoted Christian and became a member of the St. Stephens Episcopal Church Family, where she always made time to volunteer her efforts to the church and her community. She loved traveling, bowling and fishing. Her most important treasure was spending time with her family and closest friends. Along with her parents, she was preceded in death by her daughter Cheryl Griffin; three (3) grandchildren Ayesha, Khalis and Tahir Griffin.
