While at Mott, his leadership led to the construction of a state-of-the-art skills center. After his retirement, Michael and Lee moved to Ocala, Florida, so that he could golf all year long. He was fortunate to meet many wonderful neighbors and friends in Countryside Farms and was proud to serve as President of the HOA. He was a member of the VFW. Michael was a man possessed of old-fashioned virtues and values. He did not pursue wealth or recognition. He took

satisfaction in work well done. He would help anyone. He was a kind, gentle, generous man who could facilitate solutions in a wide range of dilemmas.
