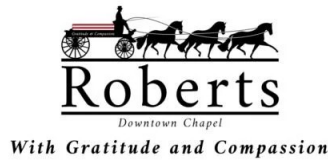

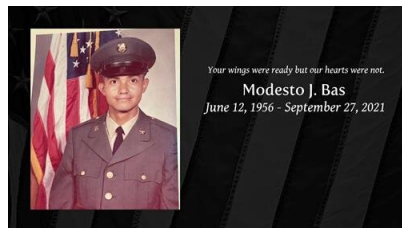

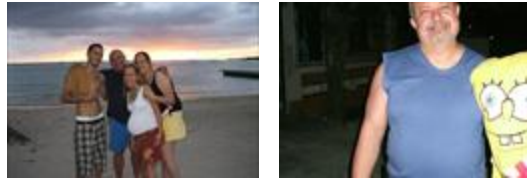
“ *Linda Davila I was going through some old photos of Germany and found these. The first one is your dad. I was his driver when I arrived in Germany. I believe these pictures are from 1987 or 88. We put some serious miles on that jeep. Your dad was constantly on the radio or looking at his map. He didn't like the Army's MRE's, (Meals Ready to Eat) so we often stopped at a bakery (Bäckerei) or a meat market (Metzgerei) and got stuff for sandwiches. He was very kind and always shared what he bought with me...I didnt like the MRE's much either...That jeep was our home away from home for that entire exercise...They called it REFORGER, or return of forces to Germany...We stayed in soccer fields, or schools, and once on some large estate in the middle of nowhere. Eventually, the next year, we traded in that jeep for a new Hummer. On the way back from Frankfurt, he turned to me and said, "Let's see what she's got"...we got up to about 80 mph on the autobahn headed back to Bamberg. Anyway, good times...God bless you and your family, and I hope this brings a smile through your sadness...*
