



## Nancy Jean Dreimiller

February 17, 1947 - February 1, 2024

Nancy Jean Dreimiller (LaMarche) passed away peacefully in the early morning hours of February 1, 2024 after a brief illness. Her family had all been present in the hours preceding and were able to get one last photo together, as she wished. Her husband was beside her as she quietly passed on.

Nancy was born in Glens Falls, NY on February 17, 1947 to Marion Little and Alfred LaMarche, Jr. Her mother died when Nancy was a young girl, but she was fortunate to have a loving stepmother, Alice T. Morties, four half siblings, and wonderful cousins. She married Paul Nicholas Dreimiller, Jr. on October 2, 1970 and they had five children- Paul, David, Gretchen, Jeffrey, and Jamie.

She found many new activities to enjoy. She played shuffleboard with her husband and golf with the Duffers League. And she never turned down a chance to play games. She always looked forward to spending summers in Caroga, NY, enjoying day trips around the area, classical music concerts, and ample time boating on Lake George.
