In Ocala, Phyllis became an integral part of Saint Mary's Episcopal Church in Belleview, FL, taking on various roles that showcased her dedication to her faith and community. Her involvement didn't stop there. She actively participated in the Marion Oaks America Reads Program, the Utopians (a professional women's service club that provided scholarships to high school students and sponsored cultural events), the Marion Oaks Women's Club, the Marion Oaks Civic Association, the Democratic Club of Ocala and the Cosmopolitans. Through these roles, Phyllis made a lasting impact to uplift others and improve her community.

Phyllis L. Nisbett's legacy is one of profound love, hard work, and community. She leaves behind a multitude of loving family members who will forever treasure her memory. Her spirit of giving back and her dedication to making a difference will continue to inspire and resonate within the hearts of all who were fortunate enough to know her.
