A decorated U.S. Army veteran, he served as a paratrooper and was awarded the Purple Heart. Even in the face of great adversity which includes being a cancer survivor, he remained composed, dignified, and full of life.

Despite his global travels and refined taste, his greatest pride was always his

family. He is survived by his beloved wife Natalie Crane, two daughters Lori Kurtz, Stacy Crane, a stepson Egor, and six grandchildren Sean, Sydney, Rachael Justin, Josie, and Leah who will forever carry forward his legacy of resilience, generosity, and extraordinary presence.

He will be remembered not just for what he accomplished, but for how he moved through the world with elegance, strength, and an undeniable sense of purpose.

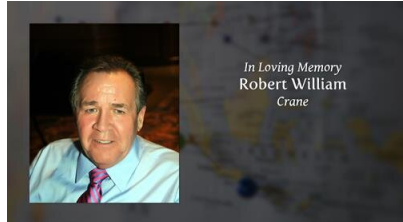
