wherever life took him. Ryan would give someone the shirt off his back if they needed it. He was a member of Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church, where he was an active choir member, and was recently baptized with the name of his favorite Saint, Porphyrios. There will be a service for Ryan held at Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church led by Father Michael Diavatis in Asheville, North Carolina, on Thursday, June 15, 2023, at 11:00 a.m. Ryan's final earthly resting place will be at Panagia Vlahernon Greek Orthodox Monastery in Ocala, Florida, where he wished to become a monk. Ryan is resting peacefully with our Lord and honoring our Savior forever.
