Ocala - Virgil Naku, 89, a resident at On Top of the World, passed away suddenly on Monday, March 28, 2016. His wife of 59 years, Friederike, died in 2007. Mr. Naku was born December 17, 1926 in Romania and immigrated to Germany prior to World War II. Following the war, he began his career as a machinist working for the railroad in Germany. In 1956, Mr. Naku moved with his wife and two young sons to the United States in New York State. He went to work at Precision Valve Corporation, a global manufacturing company, where he was an inventor, designer and engineer. Upon his retirement, after a career spanning more than 30 years at Precision Valve, he held the position of Vice President, Engineering. Mr. Naku was a devoted husband and father and had a lifelong love of sports. An accomplished athlete and photographer as a young man, in his later years he loved to hunt, fish, play golf and watch his beloved New York Yankees. Mr. Naku is survived by his (2) sons Klaus Naku and his wife Susan of Raleigh, NC; and Rolf D. Naku and his wife Margaret of Wayne, PA; his (5) grandchildren Kristina Nusskern, Peter Naku, Kathryn Chernak, Kelly Naku and Erin Naku; and (6) great-grandchildren. Memorial Mass will be held at 8:30 a.m. On Friday, April 8, 2016 at Queen of Peace Catholic Church, 6455 SW State Rd 200, Ocala, FL 34476.
