She loved major league baseball and especially followed the Atlanta Braves, Chicago Cubs and the former Brooklyn Dodgers. When Donald retired from Pan Am, they moved to Rainbow Lakes Estates in Dunnellon, FL. They lived in RLE for over 25 years where she was active in the Gardening Club, Ladies Fireman's

Auxiliary, and Hope Evangelical Lutheran Church. Bingo was her passion and she and Donald were Queen and King of Bingo many times at Dunnellon's American Legion Post 58.
